On March 31 I was pleased to MC the IFC funding announcement for the new Tweed Kiwanis Accessible Playground which was one of 6 projects that were successful. Congratulations to all!

I would like to congratulate Centre Hastings for 2 funding announcements - replacement of the the trails bridge on Moira Lake and their most important one - successful funding for a new 128 bed long term care home. Mayor Tom Deline has been advocating for this home for years so I am very happy for him.

COVID-19 numbers have been on the rise for the last 2 weeks. We have seen daily numbers range anywhere from 9 to 37 per day. The new variants are highly transmissible.

We are now on our second Stay at Home Order. We are being asked to only go out for essentials and exercise.
