Beautification, Outdoor Exercise, and Open Air Burning

The Municipality of Tweed, along with community partners, have been working diligently this year to enhance various areas in the community.

CROSSWALKS

The crosswalks at the intersection of Victoria and Spring Streets have been revitalized. New planters, recycling and waste bins, decorative lighting, and crosswalk lighting have been replaced. Along with these changes there are also new benches and enhanced accessibility to the entrance of the crosswalk. Residents are reminded to use the new crosswalk buttons to activate the lights above the crosswalk for better visibility.

SIGNAGE & PLANTERS

The Business Retention and Expansion Committee along with the Municipality of Tweed are working to replace the "Welcome To Tweed" signs that are located at both the north and south entrances to the village.

New planters have been added to the downtown area this year for the beautification of Victoria Street

Many of these projects have been completed with provincial funding from Ontario's Main Street Revitalization Program.

FITNESS EQUIPMENT

There have also been major additions to our Recreation Area this past summer with the installation of Seniors Outdoor Fitness Equipment.

The equipment was purchased with funding from the New Horizons For Seniors Program through the Province.

The equipment has quickly become a new favourite of many residents at the recreation area blending activities that promote health and wellness for all ages.

FARM TO TABLE

The 2nd Farm To Table event took place on Saturday, July 20th and was a resounding success. A huge thank you to the volunteers and residents who helped to support this

tremendous community event!

OPEN AIR BURNING

Council would like to remind residents that burning in dense areas such as the Hamlets or in the Village of Tweed can cause nuisance smoke for your neighbours. Council is considering changing the current setback requirement of 3 meters from structures, to 9 meters for open air burning.

LEMONADE STANDS

A number of youth from the community were given the opportunity to run the lemonade stand on weekends in the summer at Victoria Parkette in the downtown core.

Over the course of 7 days individuals and duos ran the lemonade stand as entrepreneurs. A huge thank you to these young people on their business ventures this summer in the Municipality!

Roads Equipment purchase new Grader & Packer

Roads—Sulphide Road Tar & Chip, Spring Street replace asphalt, curbs, gutters, sidewalks

Road & Bridge Work in the Municipality

SPRING STEET

Spring Street reconstruction took place in June and July of this year.

The project included the replacement of asphalt, sidewalks, curbs and gutters.



Improved drainage was also included in this upgrade.

The total budgeted amount for this capital project was \$368,000.00 from the Federal Gas Tax fund.

SULPHIDE ROAD

Sulphide Road from Greenwood Road to Sulphide was tar & chipped this summer.

The total budgeted amount for this capital project was

\$445,000.000 from the Federal Gas Tax fund.

BRIDGES

Two bridges are currently being prepped for reconstruction. The Rapids Road Bridge project is currently having mandatory studies completed and is being converted to a culvert bridge. The Hawkins Bay Bridge project is set to begin in 2020. Funds to support this project: Federal 50% Provincial 33% Municipal 17%.
